Secretary's Report for meeting dated May 16th, 2009

Meeting opened 1:30 PM – Milwaukie Grange Hall

CALL TO ORDER

Preston Griffin (Club President) - Welcomed attendees & visitors. 67 total with 6 visitors.

April meeting minutes in newsletter accepted as posted. Treasurer's report was read and accepted as well.

Club Claim's – Robert Cadwell – Club books are available to new members who have attended a combination of 3 meetings or club events annually. Passed out insurance waivers for the club claims. These will need to be filled out each year. Redoing attendance sheets, check yours for correct name and email address.

GPAA Claims – Robert Wedding – Need reports on claims when you use them. Caly Q on the Calapooia River, recommended to remove from the guide book. Weyerhaeuser has closed the roads.

Outings – **Eli/Jim Dorning** –Ask club members to be thinking about places to go for next year. Contact Eli / Jim or one of the officers or bring it up during the meeting.

Club Library – Jim Dorning – Anyone that has reading material, CD's, etc, pertaining to gold, gems, metal detecting and such they would like to donate to the club, please see Jim.

Bob Rasey (Safety) — Survival - water work in it, but, don't drink the water in the streams before purifying. There are three general ways to make surface water free from disease-causing microorganisms: A) add extreme heat to the water (boiling and distilling), B) add disinfectant (<u>purification</u>, <u>chemical</u> or <u>silver</u>), and water filtration.

BOILING – Historically, boiling water has been the main way to disinfect water from microorganisms because it kills them all if done correctly. Recommendations are to boil water for at least three minutes to kill all viruses. Bacteria and protozoa are dead at the first bubbles. But there are drawbacks to boiling water. First, boiling can require a lot of fuel and cooking equipment. Second, you must consider the long cool-down period. Third, some of the water will evaporate before it is ready to drink. Fourth, the water will still have particulate substances in it, so you should use a clean handkerchief to filter it before drinking. Last, boiling water does not eliminate pollutants, poor taste or foul odors. In fact, boiling can give water a stale taste. A helpful hint to improve the taste is to transfer water from one container to another several times while boiling.

CHEMICAL – Two primary chemicals are used for purifying water: iodine and chlorine. These two chemicals are lightweight, low-cost and relatively easy

WATER FILTRATION – Water <u>filtration</u> simply means to strain out the impurities from a water source. The larger the impurity particulate the easier it is to filter. The opposite is true also, the smaller the impurity particulate, the harder it is to remove. Thus, the size of the filter pore and the durability of the filtering element are important to the filter's longevity and ability to perform. Most filtering elements are made of ceramic, glass fiber, hard-block carbon, or materials that resemble compressed surgical paper.

Eli announced a new Pack Raffle with new mining items being added monthly until the drawing. Price - \$5 per ticket.




