Secretary's report for regular meeting of April 17, 2011 Milwaukie Grange Hall, 12015 SE 22nd, Milwaukie, OR

Meeting called to order at 1:34 p.m. by President Al Lewis, who welcomed members, prospective members and guests. 63 persons were present, including 59 members who signed in.

Secretary's report for the March meeting as printed in the April newsletter was corrected to include as part of the Treasurer's report that Eli Nicholson had repaid the club all advanced money in connection with his previous duties, and was accepted as corrected.

Treasurer's report included March revenue and expenses, and the Gold Show gross proceeds, and was approved as presented. Members are reminded to keep saving Flavorpac and Santiam labels, and to be sure to let GPAA know of your membership in this club when paying for GPAA membership, as those items earn money for the club.

REPORTS

Club claims/membership - Robert Cadwell reminded members to fill out the attendance sheets, including your email address, with a blank page available for new people. Club books are available for \$8 each.

Outings - Outings scheduled are listed in this newsletter and on the website. Robert Cadwell stated that sign-up sheets will be available at the meeting before each outing. Members also suggested several other sites to be considered for outings.

GPAA claims - Robert Wedding reported that Bob Rasey will also be a GPAA manager, and reminded members who are also GPAA members that they can work GPAA claims.

Library - Beau Gordon reported that he has materials to be loaned out to club members, and asked that materials please be returned at the next meeting.


Jim Dorning conducted the raffle for \$1 and \$5 ticket items.


