



The History of Sumpter Oregon

Well depending on what version you go by Sumter Oregon either was found by a Lieutenant and another man walking to fort Sumter or it was found when 5 men were on the way to California and stopped to rest and started panning the small creek they camped by. Either way it was around the late 1850's or early 1860's again depending on what story you are reading, History seems to be a little fluid at times. The people called the town Sumter, Oregon.

The first post office in the area was established in 1874 and ran till 1878 then re-established in 1883 and at that time the name of the town was renamed to Sumpter, Oregon. Sumpter grew very slowly as the only way into the town was a very small one lane road. After sometime the route soon became the stage coach road and soon became the main road, connecting all the little boom towns and mines in the area. Once hard rock mining began in the Sumpter valley and also the pneumatic drill was introduced about 1895 the town really started to grow in size.

Soon stamp mills for crushing ore and new methods to chemically extract the gold added to the growth of the town. In 1897 a railway was extended into Sumpter, the population at that time was about 300 towns folk and the US Census for 1903 showed 3,500 registered voters. Not including women, children or the Chinese. The population could have been more than 10,000 by some estimates.

Now in 1899 brick buildings started to be built, streets started getting paved (really?), The Sumpter Valley Railroad started delivered as much as six car loads of mining machinery each day, and hauled six hundred car loads of timber each month to mills in Sumpter and Baker City. There were 7 (seven) daily stage lines in Sumpter connecting the surrounding mines and towns.

Millions of dollars of gold were extracted from the mines around Sumpter, with the daily wage for miners being \$4.00 a day for a 10-12 hr. shift. The peak of the gold rush came in the early 1900's when in one year they pulled out \$8,943,486 from 35 mines in the area. (Now at 20 dollars on ounce) that's a lot of Gold!!! At TY ROY we are only about 23 miles from all this History.

Well that's all for now about the Sumpter area, more next month.

Not many of us have encounters with officials when we are out prospecting, but if you are

approached by a government law enforcement agent such as the Bureau of Land Management or US Forest Service here are the suggestions from Public Lands for the People on how to conduct yourself.

Suggested Challenge Procedure:

While pursuing your outdoor endeavor of work, play, recreation or sport and you are challenged by a representative of a governmental Agency or Public Servant regarding the legality of your activity in their area, you should **do the following:**

- 1. It is wise to politely ask if you are breaking any laws. If you are informed that you are breaking the law, then ask for an explanation of the law and any municipal code that may pertain to the law.
- 2. You should do as you are asked by the government representative, then ask for their name, badge number, position and the agency and district they represent. Record this information along with the date, time and location of the area you are in.
- 3. If you have a pleasant response from any of the agents, such as being informative, cooperative or helpful, we (PLP) would like to hear about them.
- 4. Give this information to your local PLP office or representative and he or she will advise you of the procedure to follow.
