Article of the Month

So a couple months ago my friend Bruce Wickward and I went to Washington State to do some scouting of an area that looked really good. It was south and east of Mt. Saint Helens, after you go past all the reservoirs. There are three of them, it was quite the drive but it was so pretty.

I told him I had never been here before and was taking my time just enjoying the view. We got to the spot I had seen on google earth, it wasn't that hard to find. I went out with pan, pick and the shovel, started digging down, about 2' down I hit what I thought was bedrock, but it really looked strange it had all kinds of little rocks and sticks in it, but it was hard as concrete, then it hit me ASH!!! From Mount St. Helens, I tried several spots but to no avail. It was like trying to dig at pioneer court house square. So we gave up. It was just too hard and I didn't have a good jack hammer with us, So we decided to just drive around and look at stuff trying to find a better spot.

Well after about 20 min. Bruce asked me if I had ever been to Mount St. Helens. I said nope been to the interpretive center off of I-5 but that was about it and it was probable 25 years ago, So he said lets go there! I said OK. So we proceeded to go the long way around to the Mountain. Folks let me tell you the truth if you've never been the long way around to St. Helens You have to go. We ended up at the windy ridge observatory (it is very aptly named) it is a strong wind that never seems to go away. We were about 15 or so miles away from there when I started seeing the first of the devastation. It was so awesome, the closer we got the worst it got. When I saw Spirit Lake for the first time WOW is all I could say. I got some great pictures from that day and I would like to share some with you I hope you enjoy them as much as I did taking them.

But nothing and I mean not one thing, compares to going there yourself. I will try to explain what each picture is of.



This was the very first view I had of the mountain. We were about 30 miles from it.



First good view of the crater. We are about 15 mile or so from it and you can see the tree to the right is completely striped of everything. Top snapped off.



Here we are about 12 miles away, and this was one of the hills facing the mountain.



About 8 miles from the mountain and this hill got its top completely cleaned down to the bedrock. Everything you see that is growing, has been growing from that day, May 18th 1980, everything was gone on this hill on that day.



First look at spirit lake, that is what 1,000,000 trees look like 34 years after they were blown into the lake most have sunk down to the bottom, the ranger I talked to later, said there are still about 400,000 trees floating in the lake. The first few years the whole lake was covered with trees.



From the first picture of the Lake to this picture we drove about 1 mile or so. That is how big the log jam on the lake is, It is so big the ranger said they could build 30,000 two bedroom homes with just what is in the lake.



This is at the Windy Ridge Observatory, The Lake is at the bottom of the picture, the crater is to the left and as far as you can see, (according to the ranger is about 17 miles to the summit of the hill there in the distance. It laid waste to everything you see. They figure about 1,700,000,000 board feet of lumber went poof that day. That's 1 billion by the way.





This was the best view I could get of the mountain that day and if you look really close on the right hand side of the top picture you can see a rock slide in progress. I truly hope you enjoy this as much as I did. It truly is something special. By the way the cliff you see where the rock fall was, it's about 700 ft. high. It looks so small until you're standing right there.
