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Chapter Minutes – February 2018

Meeting called to order by Vice President Bill Bench at 1:30 P.M.

The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Attendance - 27 attendees at the meeting and 1 visiting guest was present.

Meeting Minutes - A motion was made and seconded to accept the Secretary's report of the previous month as written and published in the February newsletter. The motion was approved by the members present.

Treasury Report - Beverly Parker has a pending Treasury report.

Correspondence - Mike Lewis sent some pictures from Arizona of prospecting.

GPAA State Director - Steve Lewin was not present at the meeting.

Library - Joe Weber encouraged people to take out a book and return it the following month.

Claims - Jerry Johns talked about nothing going on right now at our Tyroy claims located near Baker City, OR. because of the time of year. He did talk about our problems at the Washington claims along the east fork of the Lewis river. There was a problem with paperwork getting processed before the deadline so we need to re submit the paperwork.

Gold & Treasure Show - Jerry Johns talked about the upcoming show that is on March 24th and 25th in Ridgefield, WA. This year the 4 chapters that will be participating are Vancouver, Everett, Mid Valley and Portland. Jerry asked all members to consider volunteering for at least 1/2 a day or more so a volunteer sign up sheet was passed around for people to sign up on and to tell us what size shirt they

wear. There will be many duties like help set up booths on Friday, work with admissions, provide security people, staff the GPAA major prize raffle, man the panning booth, work in our own booth and tear down. The volunteer shirts will be blue this year. The more volunteer participation we have from our chapter the more money our chapter will get. Lunch will be provided to all volunteers. Veterans have free admission with ID as well as free admission for children 12 and under. Tickets will be \$10 at the door or they are available through our chapter for \$5. There are 2 confirmed celebrities attending the show. Emily Riedel from the T.V. show Bering Sea Gold will be talking about diving and Richard Beneville who is the mayor of Nome Alaska will be telling stories. The deadline for vendors to sign up is March 1st and so far we have 25 confirmed vendors. There will be a specific area for metal detecting and a couple booths will be selling them. There will be a child metal detector to be raffled off. Going through AU Gold there will be 1 or 2 trips to Alaska raffled off also. Besides the usual panning booth there will be a mucking and speed panning contest. There will be a picture board with a display of clean up projects. If anybody has some pictures you are encouraged to bring them. Parking at the venue will be \$6 a day or \$10 for both days. RV parking is also available.

Education - Bill Bench brought up the idea of a Show & Tell for the next month's meeting for anyone that has made anything to do with gold mining/prospecting.


We would like to pass along our LDMA membership to someone who would appreciate the opportunities LDMA membership offers. Our membership is transferable and fully paid for with only monthly maintenance dues (\$10/month) ongoing. Current price for a new membership runs upwards of \$3K. We are asking a nominal transfer fee of \$500 (payable to us). LDMA requires an application to be filled out and accepted before transferring the membership. They also require a \$150 transfer fee plus \$450 for lifetime membership in GPAA = \$600 (payable to GPAA). Total price for the transfer would be \$1,100. We can furnish copies of preliminary paperwork that includes transfer procedures and contract information to anyone seriously interested in joining LDMA.
