2023 Pacific Northwest Sportsman's Show

The Sportsmen's Show Committee was comprised of myself, Rocky Tester, Cindy Wright, Ken Didier and Jessyca Harman. Meetings were held prior to the show to discuss what we would and would not have in the booth and where those items would come from.

Since we had over 900,000 points with GPAA, we decided to use those points to purchase items to sell at the show. We ended up buying four detectors, of which three were used to sell raffle tickets and raise money for our chapter. Instead of having three different colors of tickets (one for each detector) we placed containers in front of the booth and people could put their tickets into the container of the items they would like to win. We have additional inventory to be used for raffles at meetings. Ticket sales went well; however I feel the quarter drop did not do as well as in prior years.

Following the show, the committee met to discuss how the show went, what we could do differently next time and set some ideas on paper to consider for following years and different shows. I over staffed the booth, so in future years and with a single booth we will only need a max of four people per shift. We will reduce the number of items for sale to two or three including the quarter drop and put emphasis on getting new members.

Volunteers made the show a success and some worked set up, plus all five days of the show. In my mind that is a true volunteer, that really wants to make the chapter a successful organization. I want to thank each and every person who volunteered to help in the booth, many of which are relatively new members. At the next meeting we will have a drawing, (for those who worked the show) for a gold nugget. Be sure to bring your pink tickets.
